Whether you are for it or against it, war is here. It's in our face and pierces our hearts. And mostly every person has a strong position on it. Do you feel you should have to apologize for that? The Dixie Chicks did. In early Marcl, lead singer Natalie Maines stated to a London audience in reference to Bush's push for action against Iraq, "Just so you know, we're ashamed the president of the United States is from Texas."
One week later, she posted on the Dixie Chick website that she felt that "the president was ignor ing the opinion of many in the U.S. and alienating the rest of the world." She further went on to state that one of the privileges of being an American is that you are free to voice your own point of view.

Oe day later came a formal apology to the president. We, the Editorial board at Talon Marks, greatly appreciate free speech. We have a whole category devoted to it on this very page (the Opinion page.)

Although Maines might not have said the nicest thing, she said it. She obviously said it because she meant it. Maines was correct in saying what she said because it was her opinion. The first amendment says that no person may be prohibited the free exercise of speech.
There were many fans and Bush supporters who immediately turned on the Chicks. On March 14, a total of eight Texas radio stations stopped playing their albums, and on March 15 , a few hundred protesters lashed back at Maines by using 33,000 pound tractor to destroy Dixie Chicks ed's and memorabilia.

ur opinion? Maines should have stuck with her first statement. It didn't do much danage to their place on the Billboard charts (as of March 24, The Dixie Chicks cd , "Home" was number one). Besides, once it wa said, it was most likely never to be forgotten.
It is better to have a strong opinion than to change one because someone else doesn't agree with it. Hey, you may not like what we're saying now, but it's your decision whether or not to continue reading.
And as for the few hundred protesters who bashed Maines, they forget that by protesting, they themselves are stating their opinion. Just as Maines did in the beginning.
