Pcople came to see the queen, the lloats, the cheerleaders and the game of the year. The Falcons ( $6-1$ overall, - 1 in conference) made a comeback after falling behind in the lirst half of the game.
In the second quarter, Mt. San Antonio's Cameron Stewart scored a touchdown to heip the Huskies take a 7-0 halftime lead.

In the third quarter, the Falcons tied the score, 7-7, with a touchdown
by running back Jermaine Whiten, who scored from a yard out. Loata roliniu innercepted the ball and ran 61 yards to set up the scoring drive for the Falcons.

He wore latex make-up, which Mutinez airbushed and added some detal to, making it look like there was blood in the ghoul's mouth.
