Nation-wide sport news releases Monday will announce the resignation of Earl L. Klapstein as assistant coach for the Green Bay Packers, profootball team, to become chairman of the P.E. department, athletic director, and football coach of Cerritos Junior College.

Klapstein played professional football with the Pittsburg Steelers under Jock Sutherland, and was freshman football coach for Jess Hill at the University of Southern California. He was line coach at the University of Idaho, and head coach of the Stockton College football, track, and swimming teams. Prior to his college coaching experience he served for two years as P.E. director at Manteca High School.

The new CJC physical education director received his M.A. degree at College of the Pacific, took graduate work at Washington State, and is currently working on his doctor's degree in P.E. at USC.

He is 34, married, has three children, aged 3, 6, and 10, is a Masonic lodge member and an Elk. He has been active many years in youth welfare activities. Klapstein assumes his directorship at Cerritos February 4.
