REGISTRATION for the fall semester at CJC began Monday for students enrolled in spring term classes. Registration will continue throughout the term.

BELIFLOWER High School students Monday and Tuesday are taking CJC entrance examinations given by Dr. Robert Baker. Artesia High School students are scheduled to take the examinations June 4 and 6. Excelsior High School students completed the tests last week.

Findings of several years' study of arctic animal life as well as results of California wildlife research will be among the "extras" offered science students at Cerritos Junior College by the newest addition to the faculty, Henry E. Childs, Jr.

Childs, currently a science instructor at Compton Junior College, will spend this summer at the northern-most point in Alaska, Point Barrow, doing research on arctic birds and mammals. This summer project, his third in Alaska, will be sponsored by the U. S. Office of Naval Research.

At Cerritos JC, Childs will teach life science, anatomy and zoology. A former research biologist at University of California, Davis campus, Childs studied effects of wildlife on cattle production at San Joaquin Experimental Range.

Childs holds membership in three science groups, Sigma Xi, Southern California Academy of Science and Cooper Ornithological Society, and has written 15 articles for science journals. He is vice-president of the ornithological society, which bands birds and bats for the United States Fish and Wildlife Service.

In 1954, Childs was "Dr. Zoo I. Q." for Fresno Zoo's radio program. Last year he advanced to candidacy for a Ph.D. at UC, Berkley campus, where he received his M. A. in 1951.

In joining the Cerritos JC staff, Childs said, "It is my pleasure to affiliate with a growing, dynamic school and staff where the attitude is one of enthusiam and a desire to excel in the academic as well as the athletic field".

Childs and his wife, Mary, live at 15053 Neartree Road in La Mirada, where their children, Stephanie, 9, and Eric, 7, attend Escalona School.
