Staff Prepares for Fall Term

Three major steps in preparation for the 1957 fall semester were completed during the past two weeks by CJC administrators and staff members when the college class schedule and catalogue were completed, and courses of University of California parallels established.

University parallel courses were set at a recent meeting of UCLA officials and Miss Genevieve Humiston, registrar. Course parallels were explained by Miss Humiston as the comparison of the content of CJC transfer courses with university courses of the same credit value. These parallel content courses include only those that would be taken by students working towards a four-year university degree.

All persons applying for admission to CJC will receive a copy of the catalogue and class schedule in the mail, according to Dr. Robert Baker, assistant director. He added that other persons desiring copies can obtain them by going to the college office, 11442 E. Alondra Blvd., Norwalk, or by writing the registrar at the college office.

Arrival of 100 books at CJC library last week brought the total of volumes there to 3300. Leroy Otto, librarian, said that he expects to have 3500 books by July 1 and 4000 by the end of August.
