CAMPUS CONSTRUCTION RUSHES AHEAD; ARCHITECTS RECEIVE NATIONAL AWARD

An unusual amount of fair weather has pushed Cerritos College's campus plans even further ahead, according to word from Falcon officials.

Many major portions of the campus will be completed prior to the 1959 summer school session. A high percentage of construction will be ended by the time the first full time day schedule begins this coming September.

Initial work has already begun on the college's new stadium. The Board of Trustees officially named the stadium, appropriately enough, Cerritos College Stadium. The professionally-styled baseball field was also named Falcon Field by the trustees.

The next increment of buildings scheduled for construction includes a second science building, library, men's gymnasium and the metal shop. Plans for the rest of the campus will be completed by July 31, 1960. A projected increment includes the music-drama-TV building, arts and crafts, and the administration unit.

Word has also been received that the architectural firm of Kistner, Wright and Wright, designers of the Cerritos campus, received national recognition for their work on the institution.

FALCONS WIN SECOND CONFERENCE BASEBALL GAME BY TROUNCING PIERCE NINE, 11-4

The Falcons swept to a sloppy but important baseball victory last Friday afternoon when they toppled the defending WSC co-champions, Pierce College, in an 11-4 rout. Cerritos, by nabbing the win, kept its loop record spotless and handed the Brahmas a second straight WSC loss.

The game saw 11 errors, 17 walks and three hit batsmen. Falcon hurler Dick Wantz survived a series of shaky innings, but got credit for the win, his sixth of the season. Al Petrushkin relieved Wantz in the ninth to finish the game.

The Falcons were able to score enough runs in the second inning to win the game. Cerritos exploded for five runs in that big inning. They added a single run in the fourth, another in the sixth, finishing up with four in the seventh. Pierce picked up single runs in the third, fifth, seventh and ninth.

FALCON TRACK TEAM AT GLENDALE FRIDAY; TO MEET LOS ANGELES CITY AND GLENDALE COLLEGES

The Falcon track team will play David to the WSC's two Goliaths this Friday afternoon at Glendale. The Falcon cinder team will take on Glendale College and Los Angeles City College in a triangular meet that will begin at 3:15 p.m.

Last weekend Cerritos placed 7th in the small school division in the annual Southern California JC Relays at Santa Ana. Weightman Dave Gammell's second-place effort in the shot put was the outstanding Falcon mark. The event was won with a toss of 49' 10 3/4".

On Tuesday, April 14, Cerritos will meet Compton College and LACC in another triangular meet. The event will be held at Compton and will also get underway at 3 p.m.

FALCONS SUFFER FIRST LEAGUE DEFEAT; PASADENA CITY COLLEGE WINS IN 4-2 SCORING

A protested loss to Pasadena City College in an important Western State Conference game yesterday sent Cerritos College's baseball team to their first league defeat. The 4-2 defeat occurred on the Pasadena campus diamond.

Pasadena's Lancers, a team that had already fallen to the Falcons once before this season scored three unearned runs to break a two-game conference losing streak. Falcon lefthander Barney Sims was the victim of the loss, his second of the season against five wins.

Cerritos was limited to five hits by a pair of Pasadena hurlers, getting four of them in the last four innings. The Falcons scored both of their runs in a come-back eighth inning that saw them tie the score and threaten to win. A one-out rally for the Lancers in their eighth, produced the winning margin.

CERRITOS BASEBALLERS FACE CRUCIAL GAME WITH LOS ANGELES FRIDAY; ON FALCON FIELD

Either pitchers Dick Wantz (6-1) or Al Petrushkin (4-1) will be coach Wally Kincaid's nomination to stop Los Angeles City College's baseball team Friday when Cerritos hosts the Cub nine. The game will be played at the recently named Falcon Field, campus diamond for Cerritos' team. The first pitch is set for 3 p.m.

Wantz and Petrushkin of the "Big Four" mound staff, have produced one of the greatest seasons for any junior college team and will be bidding for one of the most needed victories Los Angeles, winner of the Southern California JC Baseball tournament at Azusa, whipped off consecutive Western State Conference wins by easing by Ventura, 6-5, then running over Glendale, 10-6, last weekend.

The Falcons will also carry into the Cub game a team batting average of .315. Cerritos is paced by First Baseman Dave Worsham, a sophomore slugger who has hit at a .416 pace.

Los Angeles is making its strongest bid in many years for the WSC pennant. The Cubs have worn the crown only once since 1947, the league's first year. After a mediocre start at the beginning of the season, LACC came alive to sweep the Azusa tourney in four tough games and rip off two opening loop games.

Last year Cerritos and Los Angeles met twice, splitting the two-game series. The Falcons won the first game, 4-1, dropping the second to the Cubs, 8-3. Both teams ended in a fourth place tie.

Winning 19 of their first 24 games, the Falcons are making a strong bid for the conference crown. Cerritos got off to important league wins by crushing Compton, 15-6, then upending Pierce, 11-4, last Friday.

Two more crucial contests will face the Falcons next week. They will take on Ventura on Tuesday, April 14, at Ventura. On Friday, April 17, Cerritos will take on Glendale College at Falcon Field. Both games are scheduled for 3 p.m. and both are Western State Conference games.
