CERRITOS COLLEGE DISTRICT RESIDENTS FAVOR BONDS; OVERWHELMING VOTE TO FINISH COLLEGE CAMPUS

Cerritos College district residents overwhelmingly voted in favor of Cerritos College bonds Tuesday by better than a four to one ratio to finish construction of the college campus.

The excellent 4310 turnout, exclusive of invalid ballots and write-in votes, is more than double the 1700 turnout of citizens who voted on the initial college bond issue two years ago.

All five elementary school districts within the college district carried the necessary two-thirds majority. Carmenita School, shy by just three votes, was the only school precinct among the 14, to miss the two-thirds margin.

Corvallis School in the Norwalk-La Mirada District voted 435 yes to 45 no or almost a 10 to 1 favorable ratio. In the Bellflower District, Foster School with only a turnout of 8 opposed to 133 for, carried better than 16 to 1.

Artesia District with 272 for as opposed to 82 against carried better than 3 to 1. Bloomfield School District carried 5 to 1 with 84 in favor and 17 opposed. Carmenita School District, with an excellent vote at Ramona School, carried 5 to 1 with 38 no's and 108 affirmatives. Norwalk-La Mirada carried 5-1 with 2126 in favor and 420 opposed.

Dr. Ralph Burnight, Cerritos President, made the following statement, "We wish to express our appreciation to every citizen who indicated his confidence in us and who recognized the importance of education through his vote in favor of completing the campus at Cerritos College.

"In return we assure every member of our community that we will be good stewards of their trust. We will continue to prepare for our growing community with an adequate school campus and to provide an educational program which is practical and rewarding to the individual and to our community."

AUTHORIZED STUDENT ABSENCE POLICY ANNOUNCED BY CERRITOS ADMINISTRATORS

CONFERENCE ACTION LISTED AS ALL TEAMS SEE ACTION IN WEEKEND GAMES SLATED

Three Western State Conference and one non-league games highlight part of the Southland's junior college activity this coming weekend. It will be the WSC's first weekend with all seven conference teams in action.

Friday night will see Pasadena City College meet Los Angeles City College at LACC's Snyder Field. Cerritos, unbeaten in conference play, will meet Ventura at Ventura's Poli Stadium. Both Friday night games will start at 8 p.m.

Saturday night will see Glendale College meeting Pierce College at Reseda High School. Kickoff is at 8 p.m. The non conference game will be an out-of-state affair, with Compton College traveling to Boise, Idaho for a tilt with the nationally ranked Boise JC Broncos.

In games last weekend, previously undefeated Pierce fell to Los Angeles, 37-14. Pasadena broke a losing streak by downing Ventura, 36-28. Winless Compton finally found an offense and handed Glendale its fourth straight loss of the season, 48-26. Cerritos was bye over the weekend.

ONE-POINT OR TWO MAKES BIG PROBLEM FOR CERRITOS CONVERSION ATTEMPTS

Official statistics just released on the first three Cerritos College football games indicate that the Falcons have made good on only five of fifteen conversion attempts. Three were on traditional place-kicks and two were on successful two point tries.

The new collegiate rule installed for the 1958 season allows a team that has just scored a touchdown to attempt a conversion or extra point from the three-yard line. The ball may then be kicked for one point, or run or passed for two points. The rule has come in for both a great amount of criticism and support.

The Falcons like the majority of the nation's collegiate teams, have gone for the two points most of the time. Cerritos has attempted runs or passes 69% of the time while kicking 40%. Of the nine attempts for two points, the Falcons have connected twice for a total of four points. On kicking, Cerritos has booted three out of six attempts for a 50% average.

The unique position that Cerritos has found itself in is that they have scored one more point while connecting on only 22% of its attempts for the two points, than they have hitting 50% on the kicking efforts.

Halfback Dallas Moon has kicked all three of the Falcon extra points, while the two-point scores have been tallied by End Greg DeNoble and Halfback Bob Bagwell.

UPSET-MINDED VENTURA PIRATES TAKE ON FALCONS IN CONFERENCE TIL FRIDAY

Cerritos College will travel to Ventura Friday night as a favorite to down the Pirates in a Western State Conference clash. The Falcons, however, will face no easy task.

Ventura College, winless in four straight games, will be celebrating its annual homecoming and will be trying to break the string of losses. Last weekend as the Falcons were bye, the Pirates narrowly dropped a 36-28 decision to Pasadena. The loss was a close one from many viewpoints. Ventura rallied from 18-0 and 27-12 deficits to nearly upset Pasadena. The Pirates displayed a series of splendid burst in their split-T offense, keyed up by the fine running of Halfbacks Grover Morris and Doyle Keith. Ventura's Bill Haney, one of the WSC's finest quarterbacks is expected to duel Falcon signal-caller Bill Nelsen in the aerial part of the tilt. Haney has a fine end to throw to in 190-pound Jay Buckert. Nelsen will have a host of fleetbacks and wingmen as targets, including Ends John Frongillo and All-American Bob Lane, Backs Bob Bagwell, Dave Godwin, and John Sherman.

Cerritos, a team that has boomed back into national grid rankings with consecutive wins over Compton and Glendale, will be out to use the Pirates as another stepping stone to a top rating. The only Falcon loss came in a phenomenal 28-27 upset to Riverside in the season opener.

Ventura boasts one of the conference's heavier lines and will start a forward wall against the Falcons that will average 202.1 pounds. Thrown up against that bulk, will be one of the nation's leading jaysee offenses.

The Falcons have averaged 390.1 yards per game running and passing while rolling up 97 points in three contests. Ventura Coach Jim Moore, in his sophomore year as the Pirate mentor, has made it quite plain that his season would be a success with a victory over Cerritos.

Last year the Falcons won a 34-7 game in their march to the Junior Rose Bowl.

Friday night's game will be played at Ventura's Poli Stadium, located at the Ventura High School campus. Kickoff time is 8 p.m.
