#### Peer Evaluation

In the past tenured instructors had been considered "proven" and it was because of this status that the bill was brought up for consideration.

"It makes peer evaluation. His committee was formed when subsequent signing of the bill in commented Hanks, "a real part of the system." In effect it is a selfhousekeeping measure according to democratic senator Albert Rodda of Sacramento, author of the bill

> Hanks foresees peer group interchange as the heart of the process that would weed out understrable instructors. Stating that he knows most of the Cerritos faculty Hanks adds: that he "seriously doubts that there is one instructor on campus who would not want to improve (via the evaluation) committee : . and he does not infeel that anyone at Cerritos will leave," before such an evaluation took place

The individual goals of instructors can "feel that anyone at Cerritos will necessary for evaluation of instructors - be assessed by himself according to - leave." before such an evaluation took

> There is no intent to apply pressure but rather to give the instructors the chance to reflect upon their own skills and add to them via the interchanges certain to take place during the evaluation process," stresses Hanks

The dialogues to be established between the departments themselves. something that has been lacking in some departments here, according to Hanks, will be a definite plus.

Instructors will tell one another o: their goals and their methods thus getting input into situations where there has not been any such action in the past.

One of the bigger plusses. 'he feels. will be the recognition from his fellow teachers. This recognition, both from within his department and those on his evaluation committee will be a very effective means of giving recognition where in the past there has been none adds Hanks

#### Recognition

'Good teachers will be on everyone's list of evaluators." for instance he commented. Right there would be recognition

Another plus for the program would be the creation of a dialogue between the disciplines feels Hanks. This would come from the discussion that would take place on the evaluation committee of a given instructor, which would include, in all probability a faculty member from outside his department.

The evaluation committee would be set up as follows

The faculty senate would by lottery pick one member: the instructor being evaluated picks a member and the division chairman will pick a member from within the department or division. The person being evaluated also would be considered a part of the evaluation team because of his input of goals and methods he would use to achieve his

Actual evaluation on the Cerritos campus would not start until the school vear of 1973-1974. The 1972-1973 year will have departments establishing course goals, with instructor input, and submitting them to division chairman.

There are two alternatives open for instructors. One is the grievance committee if an instructor should feel that the goals of improvement are not being met and the other is that he may seek an administrative evaluation

### Ex-Falcon **Wins Rose BowlGame**

Former Cerritos College placekicker Rod Garcia of La Mirada proved himself quite a hero New Years Day.

With just 12 seconds remaining in the 1972 Rose Bowl game the first year Stanford kicker booted a 31-vord field gool to upset Big Ten powerhouse Michigan 13-12 who was tayored in the annual classic by 10 points.

Garcia, the 1970 Falcon placekicker, holds the Cerritos College record for the longest field goal at 49 yards

Garcia also kicked a 42-yard held goal. in the third quarter to knot the score at 3-3 and bit on one conversion try for a days total of seven Stanford points.

Earlier in the collegiate season Garcia missed on five different occasions against San Jose College who upset the Indians by an identical score, 13-12 Garcia kicked 14 field goals in 1971; tops in collegiate tootball.

### Harris, Robinson In Sudden Death


