market value, thus the price of a used book is always subject to increase.

ompany are bought for 50 percent of the current list price, which in turn is sold for 75 percent of the current price, which gives the bookstore a 25 percent gross profit
When a used book is sold back to the Bookstore, a 50 percent sell- back is usable.
