



ASCC presidential race heats up

It's a new race with one less slate. Rocky Pavone and Angle Villanueva fell just 26 votes shy of capturing the needed 50 percent plus one vote to assure themselves a seat as President and Vice President of the Associated Students of Cerritos College.

Samuel Osakue and Diana Schmitt captured enough votes to force a run off election that begins today and ends tomorrow.

Scott Simmons and Sisi Vaokakala were eliminated from last week's presidential race when they collected 297 votes, least amount tallied in the surprisingly strong field.

Polling booths for the run-off election are located at the Coffeee Shop patio, Social Science building near the Elbow Room, and Health Science patio near

Obviously, we recognize that nobody's going to buy or sell a vote. But a little fun lobbying is good for the body politic.





Rutan grad speaker May 20 Sports wrap up, head for playoffs

Renowned pilot Dick Rutan will speak at the 33rd annual commencement here at Cerritos College Sunday, May 20 at 5:30 p.m.

Rutan has led a distinguished career as an Air Force pilot and has successfully flown 325 Vietnam combat missions.

Before his retirement from the Air Force in 1978, he had been awarded the Silver Star, five Distinguished Flying Crosses, 16 Air Medals and a Purple Heart.

Rutan has received two honorary doctorate degrees, is a strong supporter of education, and a strong choice to speak at the upcoming commencement.

In all, 1,296 votes were tallied. The most in recent history. Pavone and Villanueva earned 622, while the next closest was Osakue and Schmitt who brought in 372.

Last week the campaign committee for Pavone and Villanueva gave away free 7UP, RC, doughnuts and cookies with proof of voting.

It is expected that Osakue and Schmitt will pull out all devices to compete with Pavone and Villanueva.

This will be the second runoff election since 1984. Last year Bill Robertson and

Clay Blackmer forced a runoff against Manuel Rincon and Alicia Parks and lost.

Osakue and Schmitt challenged Pavone and Villanueva to a debate yesterday, but the latter party refused because of prior committments. Some say, strategically, it was a good move since Pavone and Villanueva seem to be ahead in the race to

capture the seats of President and Vice President.

The votes will be counted Thursday evening after the polling booths close at 9 p.m. A winner will be announced when the votes are tallied. The victors will be sworn in during an innauguration ceremony at next Wednesday's Student Senate meeting.
